A successful grant application was made to the RATA Foundation by the Nelson Tasman Community Transport Trust for \$5,300 to cover both the co-ordinator's contract payments and some administrative costs. This should be available in the next fortnight With the purchase of dedicated passenger vehicle by the Nelson Tasman Transport Trust (NTCTT) for the Motueka Community Bus (MCB) there will be more flexibility in terms of the MOtueka to Richmond route being able to add extra days and on-demand stops. These will be of benefit to our own local residents The NTCTT Trust has appreciated MDCA's role in sharing the support for the MWW service and will be grateful for the ongoing provision of being able to deposit passengers' payments and withdraw \$ for the purchase of petrol vouchers to reimburse the drivers . We look forward to the Măpua Community Hub Currently the Trust and Working Group members are working on developing a comprehensive feasibility study to provide a solid foundation for future funding applications and appointment of a project manager Draft architectural plans have been presented to both the Trust and the Hills Community Church members for comment and feedback and the intention is for other community groups/organizations (including MDCA) to be involved in this process to allow maximum input from the community .
