### MLWG Report

Minor updates since our recent Exec Mtg:

#### Community Survey

- circulated updated draft questions / survey area maps incorporating key questions from 2019 Survey and to Exec for review.
- provide feedback to Lou on draft Survey Monkey questionnaire

#### Reserves

- participated in Reserves Management Plan Public Submissions hearing via Zoom
- committee was receptive to MDCA feedback around need to add more greenspace and reserves as community grows
- Councilors' asked if MDCA would support local residents in updating existing / adding new signage for Brabant Drive to McKee Domain walking tracks

#### Walking and Cycling

- participated in Stakeholders Strategy Webinar. Final submission due 7th March at 4pm
- It was stressed that current strategy is very much Urban-focused, enabling school / work commute trips within 2-3 km around Nelson / Richmond CBDs via dedicated separate lanes (requiring removal of parking).
- In regional centres such as Motueka, Māpua, Wakefield etc focus is on slowing traffic and creating "Greenways" - shared slower roads meaning cyclists don't need to use footpaths
- No firm plans as yet regarding how developers may be required to provide walkways / cycleways / connections to active transport.

#### Future Development Strategy (FDS) / Growth Plan Change

- TDC Policy Planner Myaan Bengosi advised that the Nelson City Council and Tasman City Council will be holding online joint webinar (1 hour long) on the draft FDS with key stakeholders including MDCA.
- A webinar has been scheduled for the 23<sup>rd</sup> of March at 6pm with the FDS team and all members are encouraged to participate.
- A Growth Plan Change is being proposed as part of the FDS which could have significant impact on the Māpua Community, with rezoning of land either side of Seaton Valley Road from Rural and/or Rural Residential to Residential and higher density housing within existing Residential areas.
- MDCA considers growth in Mapua and its related social and economic impacts to be the a critical area in which we can continue to proactively engage with TDC to ensure that our overarching Livable Māpua goals are achieved over the coming years and decades.
- Christine McKenzie raised the potential for relooking at the anticipated Māpua Growth in a more holistic manner
- The MDCA Exec is fully supportive of undertaking an updated Māpua Spatial Plan which would include not only housing, but also key greenspace/reserves, roading, parking, active transport and social services requirements, together with impacts of potential projects such as the Boat Ramp and additional Commercial Development in our area.
- TDC will conduct follow-up discussions and any decisions will be shared with community stakeholders.

#### 3 Waters

- received email from TDC via Robyn Shearer updating 3 waters reform and its key implications for Council, namely:
  - develop new water safety plans
  - implement new source water protection requirements
  - implement more stringent sampling and monitoring requirements
  - increase focus on the management of risks and hazards
  - water suppliers to give effect to 'Te Mana o te Wai' to the extent it applies to their functions and duties
- Implementing these will incur costs of ~\$2M over the next 3 years

#### General

- Tim and Janine - planned "get together" for the community association/resident's association chairs delayed until things covid settles down, hopefully in a few months and when we know we can meet face-to-face.
