Bibash Chhetri Road Engineer,

Dear Sir,

The decision to site a bus stop in front of shops at the intersection of Aranui Rd and Mapua Drive, Mapua, appears to have been made without consultation with stakeholders, i.e., the fruit and vege shop / Streets for People planners / Mapua Community Association.

What is the rationale for a bus stop there? Patrons departing from there will need to park their cars somewhere - parking is already contested in the area, and passengers arriving will be a very long walk from their potential destination of Mapua village and the wharf.

Cars are constantly traversing the area of the proposed bus stop to get to and from the fruit and vege shop (and potential liquor store) having to back to get out onto the road across the designated bus stop. Traffic and pedestrian flows in this area make it a hazardous place to site a bus stop.

If it is so desirable to have bus stop there, it could be sited closer to Aranui park where passengers could get on and off the bus without being endangered.
