<p><b>General Business</b></p>	<p><b>Mapua Masterplan:</b>        As a result of the discussion regarding the MWWG Marion suggested to the TDC staff a better way to consult the community was to make sure individuals or individual groups were not approached separately which creates a situation where consultation occurs in silos. Instead, it is felt a more productive method to get community members and community groups to gain an understanding of what other community members/groups were facing and what their needs are was to hear any problems/solutions they may have from their perspective. Doing this enables community groups/individual to look at the needs/wants of each group/individual there are and work collaboratively together to determine a win win solution for all, which would see how groups/individuals can come to a workable compromise.        Marion suggested to TDC the best way to achieve this was by holding brainstorming session rather than drop in sessions.        After much discussion it was thought a positive way for MDCA to contribute to the consultation process and increase the possibility TDC actually heard what residents wishes or visions are is to become the conduit and help facilitate brainstorming sessions.</p> <p><b>Letter regarding the hazards on Catherine Rd intersection:</b>        We discussed the body of Moira’s letter regarding poor visibility coming out of Catherine Place into the round-a-bout at Mapua Drive due to the plantings being too high &amp; hoping that they could be replaed with lower varieties.
